Task 3 Solve this word problem by drawing a picture: Finley has 3 red apples and 2 yellow apples. How many apples does Finley have?	Task 3 Sort 5 objects in your kitchen (pots, pans, utensils) by size - illustrate what you observe.	Task 3 Watch SciShow Kids - Draw plans for an invention that solves a problem at your house.

Task 4 Write the days of the week in order starting with Sunday.	Task 4 Solve this word problem by drawing a picture: Zoey has 4 oranges but she gives 1 orange to her friend. How many oranges does Zoey have now?	Task 4 Draw a "domesticated" animal and a "wild" animal. Label each. EX: Cat (domesticated) Lion (wild).	Task 4 Draw a map of your neighborhood. Include at least 1 community place. (Grocery store, school, library, etc.)
